The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the Division of Adult Correction & Juvenile Justice (DACJJ) in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2019-2020** beginning on, or after, December 1, 2019. The use of DACJJ funds in this county usually requires a local match. That is not the case with this RFP at this time. Future RFP's will require 20% local match.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed Programs:

Community Service/Restitution,	Psychological Assessment, Substance Abuse	
Interpersonal Skills Building, Teen	Assessment/Treatment, Family Skill	Temporary Foster Care, Therapeutic Foster
Court, Temporary Shelter, Mentoring,	Building,	Care, Day Reporting, Experiential Skill
Tutoring/Academic Enhancement	Sex Offender Assessment/Treatment	Building, Vocational Developments

Proposed Program Services should target the following Risk Factors for Delinquency or Repeat Delinquency:

Delinquent offenses by youth 12 years & over, Prior referrals for delinquent or undisciplined offenses, Most serious prior adjudication, Misdemeanors and class F-1 felonies, Substance Use, behavior problems in school, lack of pro-social peers, Lack of Parental Supervision.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for Adjudicated Youth:

Peer Domain: Peer Relationships

Individual Domain: Substance abuse, Mental Health Needs

Family Domain: Abuse, Neglect, Conflict in home, Family Substance abuse

School Domain: School Behavior Problems

Applicants are being sought that are able to address the legislatively mandated items below:

- 1) Program Services that target our Raise The Age population (16 and older)
- 2) Program services compatible with research that is shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
- 3) Program services are outcome-based.
- 4) The program has an evaluation component.
- 5) Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.
- 6) Programs that can have a demonstrable impact on the following success factors: a. reduce the use of alcohol or controlled substances; b. reduce subsequent complaints; c. reduce violation of terms of community supervision; d. reduce convictions from subsequent offenses; e. fulfill restitution to victims; and f. increase parental accountability.
